1Corinto 8:13 – "Kaya kung ang kinakain ko ay nagiging dahilan ng pagkakasala ng aking kapatid, hindi na lang ako kakain nito kailanman, para hindi magkasala ang aking kapatid."

Jose de Mesa's "Hermeneutics of Appreciation."

- 1. Presume the cultural element or aspect under consideration to be positive (at least in intent) until proven otherwise.
- 2. Be aware of your own cultural presuppositions and adopt the insider's point of view.
- 3. Go beyond the cultural stereotypes.
- 4. Use the vernacular as a key to understanding the culture in its own terms.

The goal is NOT to convince but to understand!


















How do I know that my understanding of the truth is complete? Can I not learn from others, whether right or wrong? Baka iba naman logic / reality / system of hermeneutics nila sa akin.

Mt 5:43-48 – "Narinig ninyo na sinabi, 'Mahalin mo ang iyong kaibigan, at kapootan mo ang iyong kaaway.' Ngunit sinasabi ko sa inyo na mahalin ninyo ang inyong mga kaaway at ipanalangin ninyo ang mga umuusig sa inyo. Kung gagawin ninyo ito, magiging tunay na anak kayo ng inyong Amang nasa langit. Sapagkat hindi lang sa mabubuting tao niya pinapasikat ang araw kundi pati na rin sa masasama. At hindi lang ang matutuwid ang binibigyan niya ng ulan kundi pati na rin ang mga hindi matuwid. Kung ang mamahalin lang ninyo ay ang mga nagmamahal sa inyo, anong gantimpala ang matatanggap ninyo mula sa Dios? Hindi ba't ginagawa rin iyan ng mga maniningil ng buwis *na itinuturing na masasama?* At kung ang binabati lang ninyo ay ang mga kaibigan ninyo, ano ang ginawa ninyo na nakakahigit sa iba? Hindi ba't ginagawa rin iyan ng mga taong hindi kumikilala sa Dios? Kaya dapat kayong maging ganap, tulad ng inyong Amang nasa langit."

- Juan 3:16-17 "Sapagkat ganito ang pag-ibig ng Dios sa mga tao sasanlibutan: Ibinigay niya ang kanyang Bugtong na Anak, upang ang sinumang sumasampalataya sa kanya ay hindi mapahamak kundi magkaroon ng buhay na walang hanggan. Sapagkat hindi sinugo ng Dios ang kanyang Anak dito sa mundo upang hatulan ng parusa ang mga tao, kundi upang iligtas sila.
- Gawa 10:34-35 "Kaya nagsalita si Pedro, 'Ngayon alam ko nang walang pinapaboran ang Dios. Kung ang tao ay may takot sa Dios at tama ang kanyang ginagawa, kahit ano ang lahi niya'y tatanggapin siya ng Dios."

- Roma 5:8 "Pero ipinakita ng Dios sa atin ang kanyang pag-ibig sa ganitong paraan: Kahit noong tayo'y makasalanan pa, namatay si Cristo para sa atin."
- 2 Pedro 3:9 "Hindi nagpapabaya ang Panginoon sa pagtupad sa pangako niya, gaya ng inaakala ng ilan. Ang totoo, binibigyan lang niya ng pagkakataong magsisi ang lahat sa mga kasalanan nila, dahil ayaw niyang mapahamak ang sinuman."

1 Corinto 13:1-3 – "Kung makapagsalita man ako sa iba't ibang wika ng mga tao at ng mga anghel, ngunit wala naman akong pag-ibig, para lang akong batingaw na umaalingawngaw o pompyang na tumatagingting. Kung may kakayahan man akong maghayag ng mensahe ng Dios, at may pang-unawa sa lahat ng lihim na katotohanan at lahat ng kaalaman, at kung mailipat ko man ang mga bundok sa laki ng aking pananampalataya, ngunit wala naman akong pag-ibig, wala akong kabuluhan. At kahit ipamigay ko man ang lahat ng aking ari-arian at ialay pati aking katawan upang sunugin, kung wala naman akong pag-ibig, wala pa rin akong 🥖 mapapala."

"Welcome, New Pastor, to Our Empty Church" by Maria Baer (Christianity Today)

- "Many have decided to forge ahead with the process despite the unique challenges of social restrictions and shutdowns due to the pandemic."
- "English said he briefly considered pausing the hiring process until the pandemic had passed, but he decided against it. "I don't feel like I can be the pastor of a church in a good season ... if I'm unwilling to pastor them through this, too," he said."
- "The online process, though lacking the in-person fellowship that's so important to churches, has actually given congregants more access to pastor candidates."
- "In the meantime, digital church is a temporary fix."

"Leading Beyond the Blizzard: Why Every Organization Is Now a Startup" by Andy Crouch, Kurt Keilhacker, and Dave Blanchard

- "we need to treat COVID-19 as an economic and cultural blizzard, winter, and beginning of a "little ice age" — a once-in-a-lifetime change that is likely to affect our lives and organizations for years."
- "The priority of leaders must be to set aside confidence in their current playbook as quickly as possible, write a new one that honors their mission and the communities they serve, and make the most of their organization's assets — their people, financial capital, and social capital, leaning on relationship and trust."
- "The creative potential for hope and vision is unparalleled right now — but paradoxically this creativity will only be fully available to us if we also make space for grief and lament."

Church in a Post-Pandemic Society: What if Nothing Changes? By J.D. Payne

- "I think very little will change with the Church in North America."
- "Our present paradigm for Church is difficult to change. These cultural
 manifestations have existed for centuries If a change agent applies enough
 force, the model will adjust somewhat, but once the agent is removed, it will
 return as closely as possible to the original shape. There will be some
 permanent change, but not a systemic shift.... For the most part, ministry and
 mission will flow back into the model and continue as before the crisis."
- "... not everyone who returns from the novel context of ministry to the status quo remains the same."
- "Fresh expressions have been with the Church since the beginning. The Lord has used change agents to advance His gospel beyond the norm. Persecution resulted in the birth of the Church in Antioch. It was made clear the Gentiles could be saved without circumcision. Closed doors in Asia Minor and Bithynia were part of the process that brought about the Church in Philippi. What will Kingdom life look like for your church when restrictions are lifted? We are at a historic crossroads. Will we be wise Kingdom citizens?"
