- Nang hindi sinadya


In many parts of the world disasters are not aberrations that temporarily halt development work. Often they are a constant threat that can & must be prepared for.

### Stage 1: Seeing the Invisible

When we are used to a certain lifestyle, we often don't see certain areas of the world.

# ■ Redemption & Lift Principle

"the redemption of a large number of people in a society will cause a lift in their social & economic situation. The lift takes place over a generation; it is the generation that follows that often sees that greatest change."

■ "a person is redeemed, straightens up his or her life with God & the church's help, gets serious about work, family & civic duties & becomes a respectable citizen. Soon, the former drunk is a solid citizen, & the children go on for advanced degrees, becoming a part of the upper social class"

Try to "see as Jesus saw"

- John 9:1 "Sa paglalakad ni Jesus, nakita niya ang isang lalaking ipinanganak na bulag."
- Mt 9:36 "Nang makita niya ang napaka-raming tao, nahabag siya sa kanila
- Mk 2:14 "... nakita niyang nakaupo sa paningilan ng buwis si Levi ..."
- Lk 20:23 "Alam ni Jesus ang kanilang masamang balak ..."

#### **Red Cross Code of Conduct**

- 1. Humanitarian / Makatao
- To alleviate human suffering is the primary purpose Ang nanlalait sa mahirap ay humahamak sa Maykapal, at ang nagagalak sa kapahamakan ng iba'y mayroon ding pananagutan. Pr 17:5

#### 2. Without Distinction /

- Regardless of the race, creed or nationality of the recipients
- Without adverse distinction of any kind.
- Priority on those who need help the most

Ang Diyos ba'y Diyos lamang ng mga Judio? Hindi ba't Diyos din siya ng mga Hentil? Oo, siya'y Diyos din ng mga Hentil, sapagkat iisa lamang ang Diyos. Kapwa niya tatanggapin ang mga Judio at mga Hentil dahil sa kanilang pananampalataya sa kanya. Pinapawalang saysay ba namin ang Kautusan dahil sa pananampalatayang ito? Hinding-hindi! Sa halip, pinapagtibay pa nga namin ito. Ro 3:29-3

### 3. Instruments of God / Mga Kagamitan ng Diyos

- Not instruments of government or political policy
- Aid will not be dependent on religious conversion

Ang mga taong nasa kadiliman ay nakakita ng maningning na ilaw! Sa mga nakatira sa lilim ng kamatayan ay sumikat ang liwanag. Mt 5:16

## 4. Dignity & Respect

■ We shall recognize disaster victims as dignified humans, not hopeless objects

Pagkatapos, sinabi ng Diyos: "Ngayon, likhain natin ang tao ayon sa ating larawan, ayon sa ating wangis. ... Nilalang nga ng Diyos ang tao ayon sa kanyang larawan ... Ge 1:26, 27

■ We shall respect culture & custom

Kinabukasan, isinama nga ni Pablo ang mga lalaki at isinagawa nila ang seremonya ng paglilinis. Pagkatapos, siya'y pumasok sa Templo ....Ac 21:17-26

#### **Stage 2: Holy Spirit's Calling**

- Ac 13:2 ... sinabi sa kanila ng Espiritu Santo, "Ibukod ninyo sina Bernabe at Saulo. Sila'y pinili ko para sa tanging gawaing inilaan ko sa kanila."
- Realise not every need is a call
- Do we have a leader called by God?
  - Go where God wants us
  - God-given motivation to leaders
    - "want-to motivation"

Key Idea: We may have the desire for a certain ministry but God hasn't yet provided the leader for that ministry (P.S. It isn't always you!)

- Who is concerned for the problem?
  - Advocacy groups, citizen's groups, media, NGOs
- How do they do it?
- Empowered members
- Complementary staff

## 5. Local Capacity

- Involve affected persons in the management of relief aid
- Build response on local capacities
  - Buy from local stores


## 6. Present & Future / Kasalukuyan at Kinabukasan

- To those from whom we accept resources




